## Statue of St. Joseph in the Courtyard



Saint Joseph, our spiritual father, guides us in our mission of supporting the family and supporting the Church. We are soon to have a beautiful statue of St Joseph holding the Christ child in the Holy Spirit Catholic Church courtyard.

The statue has arrived and on March 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022 David Dybala and his fellow brothers Al Evans, David Ybarra, Dan Murphy, Larry Balagna, Jose Montoya, Jack Ramsden, and Allen Reitmeier built the base and pedestal upon which St. Joseph will stand. David Dybala did all the engineering and design of both the base and pedestal.



After the concrete pedestal was poured (concrete mixed by hand in a wheelbarrow using white cement), David smoothed out the sides and top to match the pedestal upon which Mary stands.



The final job was to lift the 800 pound statue up onto the pedestal. With the “spilling of many brains” and the use of a forklift, the job went on without a hitch. And so St. Joseph now has a permanent home in the courtyard.



The Knights of Columbus once again demonstrated their commitment to be the “right arm of the church”. It goes without saying that this project was made possible by the expertise of David Dybala and the men of the Knights of Columbus who gave in total approximately 62 man hours of their time to complete this project. Well done men!!

## We are Saddened



Allen Joseph Pineda Alonzo (Allen), 54, passed away peacefully at Methodist Charlton Medical Center, Dallas, TX on March 15, 2022, after a rare, brief, and uncontrollable serious illness. He never gave up hope and never stopped fighting, even until the very end.

He was born at the University of Sto. Tomas Hospital, Manila, the Philippines on April 22, 1967, the second child of Bayani and Salvacion Pineda Alonzo.

He moved to Illinois USA with his family in 1970 ultimately settling in Duncanville, Texas in 1973.

Allen grew up attending Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Duncanville where his family was founding members.

He spent his youth around very many close Filipino family friends who had settled in Duncanville, as well as visiting cousins and relatives during summers and holidays.

Allen graduated from Duncanville High School in 1986 where he was a member of the spirit

organization, the Duffers, as well as the Drafting Club where he received numerous UIL awards.

After high school, Allen moved to Munich, Germany with his family as a result of his father's job assignment there. He resided in Germany from 1987 through 1992 where he enjoyed seeing as much of Europe as he could. Upon returning to the United States Allen returned to Duncanville.

He completed his studies in Interior Design at the Art Institute of Dallas then started working for the Army and Air Force Exchange Service (AAFES) in 2001 and retired in 2021.

Allen was very active at Holy Spirit Catholic Church serving as a fourth-degree Knight of Columbus with the church's Knights of Columbus Council 8157.

He met the love of his life, Arlene Geng Alonzo, in May 2014 and they married on February 2, 2015 at the Santuario de San Jose Parish (St. Joseph being his patron saint) in Mandaluyong City, Philippines.

Allen and Arlene welcomed their son and their life's greatest joy, Aaren Gerard, on June 9, 2016.

He is preceded in death by his mother, Salvacion P. Alonzo. He is survived by his wife Arlene, 5-yr old son Aaren; father Bayani Alonzo and stepmother Elvira; brother Vincent Alonzo and sister-in-law Carol, his Uncle Verne Pineda, M.D., Aunt Heidi Pineda, Aunt Lany Samonte, father-in-law Alex Geng and several cousins, relatives and many life long friends both in the US and in the Philippines.

## RECTORY REMODEL

When the plumbing pipes froze in the rectory at Holy Spirit Church during a very cold winter storm early this year, the floor of the ground level unit was heavily damaged and had to be replaced. Although insurance took care of replacing the floor, the Knights were called in to help remodel the rectory suite on the first floor so our Parochial Vicar, Fr Steve Antes could move into it from the suite above. This two-day Knight Hands project consisted of painting the walls and ceilings in two rooms, a bathroom and closet, and moving some furniture from upstairs to downstairs. Our plumbing skills were put into action as we replaced two old toilets with brand new ones.



The project started early on Tuesday morning February 8th, 2022 and was headed by our Worthy Family program director, David Dybala, a veteran of remodeling projects at the church—just look at what he did recently with the sanctuary. Our parish continues to benefit from his organizational and leadership skills, some of it acquired no doubt from David’s twenty years serving as the City of Dallas Public Works Director. ## K of C Fish-Fil-A

The Holy Spirit Knights of Columbus kicked off the 2022 Lent season Fish Fry's on Friday, March 4th with another drive-through operation and online sales. Last year's drive-through Fish Fry's went off very well despite the COVID-19 restrictions imposed worldwide. The key to our operation's success is the effectiveness of the order-taking process, as the car line begins to grow longer, and longer, and longer. Luckily we don't have to reinvent the wheel since a certain fast-food chicken chain has already set the bar, albeit too high for us, but it is worth trying to emulate it.



Not surprisingly the first fish fry of the year is usually well attended by both parishioners and Knights, and you could never have too many of either. On the first Friday of Lent, we sold 219 meals and most of them were preordered online, which really helps keep things moving quickly, especially when the line starts forming 30 minutes before opening time. The second Friday turned bitterly cold and windy but it did not keep the Knights from coming to work nor parishioners from coming to support us. We sold 135 meals that day despite the strong wind and icy rain. Our outdoor cooking team, led by David Ybarra and included Efrain Ochoa, David Dybala, Jose Montoya, fried the fish, the french fries, and hush puppies. During the bitter cold they managed to shelter the cooking area under a partly wrapped tent, which kept everyone warm and happy.



On the frontlines, the outside team taking the orders from hungry parishioners consists of Grand Knight Jorge Ruiz, Jesse Zuñiga, Richard Juarez, Robbie Zablan, Jim Russell, and new Knight Antonio Liska (and his 2 children). The team handled the car line very efficiently as the GK worked the laptop checking off orders and passed the info to the runners who would bring meals out to the car line. Meanwhile, the order takers greeted customers with a smile and either took an order number or a new order paid for by cash or credit card.

The drive-through service opened for business at 5:30 PM with a bright-eyed and bushy-tailed staff, but by the time the cleanup work started at 8 PM, everyone has slowed down a bit as the methodical work of cleaning, take down and put away takes us to the 9 o'clock hour.



The inside kitchen crew prepared the coleslaw, thawed out the fish, and kept the ready food warm in the ovens. Thanks to James Smith, Greg Warr, Jeff Miller, Mike Fitzgerald, Marc Evans, Larry Balagna, Eduardo Florentes, and John Espree. ## Knight Hands Keep Hammering

When Antonio Razo asked Knight Hand to install lap siding on a 15' section of sidewall on his home in Cedar Hill, we said sure. Turns out the siding he had purchased for this project was Hardy Board – a concrete board siding. All the tools we brought to the job (air compressor, nail gun, air hose) were for hardboard siding and none would work because of the fragile nature of concrete board. We were not discouraged nor stymied this little inconvenience, however. We simply pre-drilled holes at each stud location and nailed the siding on with a hammer. Good thing we had Marc Evans to do the drilling, Efrain Ochoa to do the hammering, Dan Murphy to set the siding in the correct location, Russell LeRoy to assist in cutting the materials to the correct size and Jose Montoya to assist everywhere.





We started at 9am and really got going about 10am after Dan Murphy returned from Home Depot with the proper nails to fasten the siding. Then all went well – it just took time to fasten the siding properly. Marc did an excellent job drilling and Efrain did a flawless job hammering the nails – we broke not a single piece of siding. A dab of caulking at all the joint and the job was done. While we were there we also added trim boards on a neighboring window. It took a total of about 25 man hours to complete this project. We were served a delicious burrito lunch and soft drinks as needed. Good job men!!!
