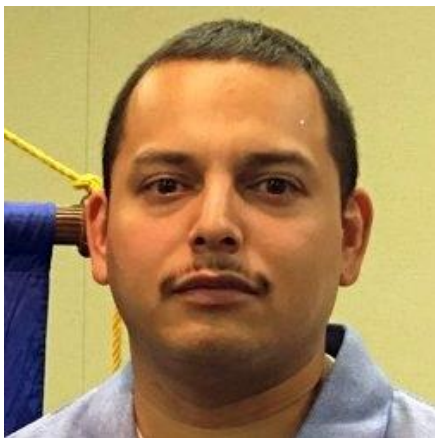

The regular season was reasonably free of rainouts, far different from a 2017 season that saw many of the Monday schedules washed out with games primarily on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. We also worked a handful of additional Saturday-Sunday tournaments plus the concluding event, the Class A World Series that ran from Thursday, June 21 through Sunday, June 24 and was preceded by the event's full day of registration, team photos and skills competition for the players.

Thanks to all of the Knights who played a role in another successful spring concessions season. We even had one weekend of adult flag football on top of baseball. All of the members of the concessions committee devoted extensive time and effort. Beyond time spent at the stands, that included the

periodic early-morning shopping runs to Sam's Club to keep the stands adequately stocked.

There also was a new look to the primary Valley Ridge stand, one that benefitted both volunteers and customers. The Cedar Hill Baseball Association bought a new freezer, a new refrigerator and a new ice-shaving machine for making snow cones.

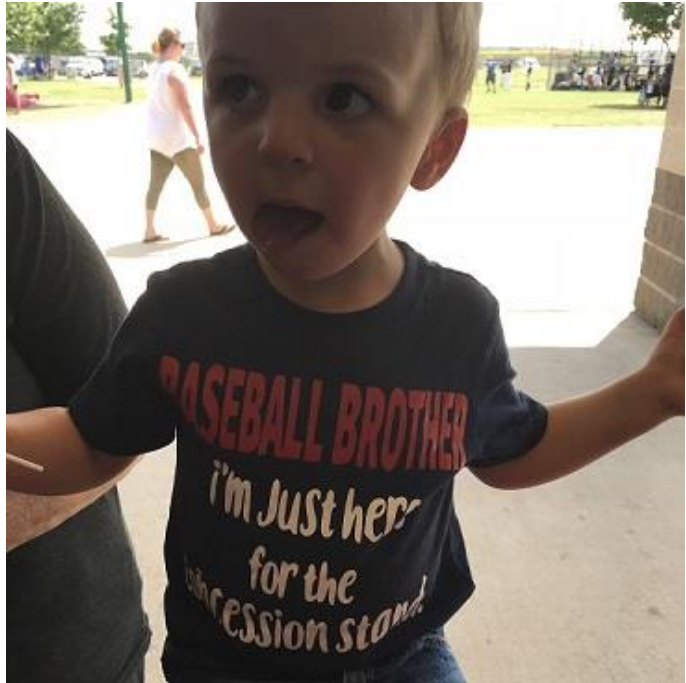
