## Final “Good Bye” for Bill

On August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021, family, relatives, friends and Knights of Columbus gathered at St. Joseph’s Catholic Church in Arlington to bid farewell to Bill Chalko for the last time. William “Bill” John Chalko Jr., son of William J. and Josie Chalko passed away on July 27<sup>th</sup> 2021 after an extended illness. Bill is survived by his wife of 44 years, Sandy, and sons William and Donald and daughter Paula. Bill had a larger than life personality and will always be remembered for always trying to get people to smile. Bill was born on July 16, 1945 and raised in Corpus Christi. He initially attended a local junior college after graduating from Ray High School before joining the Marine Corp in December 1966. He spent 22 ½ years in service to his country including two tours of duty in Vietnam where he was awarded a Purple Heart. It was during Bill’s time in the Marines that he met Sandy, one day before he was scheduled to end a stay in South Korea in autumn of 1976. He

returned in 1977 and asked her father for her hand in marriage. Bill’s final assignment with the Marines was at NAS Grand Prairie. He spent the rest of his working life at Solar Turbines in DeSoto Texas as a material planner analyst where he retired in 2011.

Bill was gladly following in his father’s footsteps when he eagerly joined the Knights of Columbus as a teenager in Corpus Christi in autumn 1964. His contributions to the Knights of Columbus in general and to our Council in particular were recognized when Bill was awarded an honorary lifetime membership by Supreme. “I thought it was a thrill to be joining an organization that my father was in,” Bill said. Bill was a past Council 8157 Grand Knight (the 1997-98 and ’98-99 fraternal years), his term including the purchase of the original barbeque trailer. He previously served as Dick Bates’ Deputy Grand Knight and Chancellor before that. A year after being Grand Knight, Bill became District Deputy, supervised the establishment of a council in Ferris and saw his territory awarded Star District. Like his farther he rose to fourth Degree. In his introductory address as Grand Knight in the July-September newsletter, Bill stated his desire that our council be “the best council in Texas and across the nation.” When he handed the reins over to Ron Soriano in July 1999, he assured the council was headed to greater heights. Bill’s enjoyment throughout his years of service to the Knights? “The people,” he said. “The desire to help people”. That sentiment has been adhered to since his departure. And even though his presence now can only be felt in our hearts, his influence will last forever. We shall sorely miss Mr. Bill Chalko

## Farwell to John



This story started out as a welcome article to a new Knight – John Monturo. John spent the first 26 years of his life in Poughkeepsie New York. John said the city was “mostly Italian and 99% Catholic”. He earned a Bachelor’s Degree and a Master’s degree and used them for a short time teaching college history courses at Paris Junior College – Greenville branch. Sometime in the 1990’s John decided he wanted to learn to speak Spanish, and so was introduced to Juanita – his new Spanish teacher. A few years later in 1998 they were married. Juanita now works at Cook’s Children’s Hospital in Ft. Worth as a transition specialist. John was now reluctantly retired because of surgery to remove a brain tumor. During this difficult time John said “I turned everything over to God. I was told I probably wouldn’t be able to walk, talk, or see after the operation, but everything worked out just fine” John was brushing up on his guitar skills as well as setting puzzles with Juanita. He was also exercising regularly as he teaches Juanita how to swim. John was currently writing three books all at the same time. John joined the Knights because he “wants to give back”. He said he was “willing to help wherever needed”.

Sadly this story has an unhappy ending. It is with utmost sadness that we announce the passing of our brother Knight John Mario Monturo. John passed away Tuesday September 7th, one day before his 61st birthday and a just 5 days from his 23rd wedding anniversary to Juanita. John had suffered some serious illnesses in the last few years and was in a more fragile state than his steady demeanor indicated. John joined the Knights this past July and was very excited to become a member of the Knights of Columbus and helped with the sanctuary restoration. Juanita said he had checked out the Cedar Hill concession stand because he thought we might be calling for help. John and Juanita were very happy to have attended our Awards Ceremony in August. They have an adult daughter, Laura, who lives in Keller. While we knew John for only a short, we will miss his happy demeanor and his helpful attitude.

## Returning the Pews

Knight Hands were once again called upon by the church; this time to return the pews from the Narthex to the sanctuary at the Church. You may recall that on June 5<sup>th</sup>, Knight Hands unbolted and moved all the pews from the sanctuary to the Narthex to make room for the contractor to grind, sand, stain, and polish the floor in the sanctuary. Moving the pews to the Narthex took about an hour with 26 Knight Hands participating. Moving the pews back into the sanctuary was a much more complicated process because all the bolts in the floor had to lined-up with the holes in the pews.



But on Sunday afternoon July 11<sup>th</sup> 2021, 21 Knight Hands gathered and after a prayer for thanksgiving and safety, they proceeded to move the pews back into their original positions.



John Espree, Manuel Urias, Carlos and Profi Limones, John Monturo, and Jim Ouimet, loaded the pews in the Narthex on dollies and rolled them into a staging area in the sanctuary. Russell Gully, Mike Fitzgerald, Keith Archer, Allen Reitmeier, Art Rodriguez and Jorge Ruiz did the heavy lifting as the pews were lined up into position. David Ybarra and Efrain Ochoa guided the pews onto the bolts. Dan Keough, Paul Ryan, Robert Nieto, Frank Salazar, James Smith and Jack Ramsden then secured the pews to the floor by installing the nuts on the hold down bolts. David Dybala supervised the whole affair. To our delight Father Eugene appeared and

pitched right in and helped with the heavy lifting for at least 2 hours. We were most impressed. A number of anchor bolts had to be replaced and epoxied into place (David Dybala also did this with an assist from Dan Sheridan). Re-installing the pews took a total of about 76 man hours.

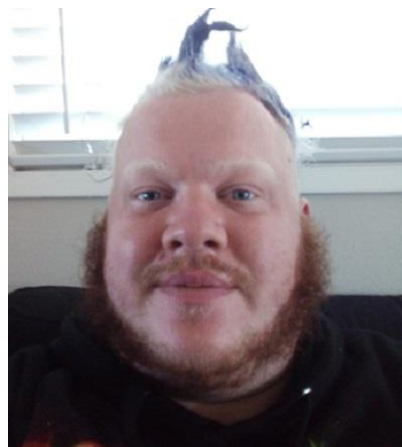


**Miguel Hizar**
