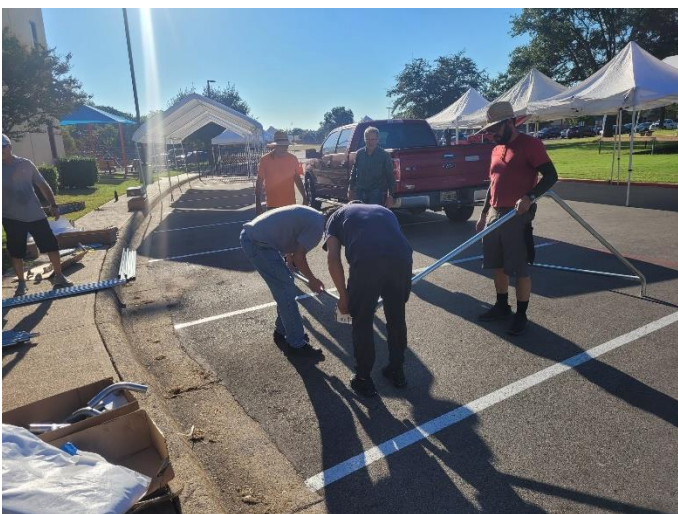
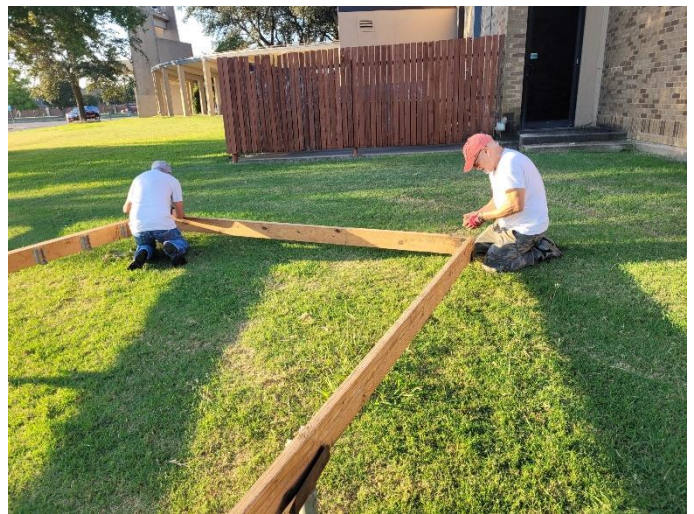


Do you ever wonder how many hours Knights work to make the Fall Festival a success? Let's see if we can figure it out. The first chore for the Fall Festival was setting up the gymnasium for the rummage sale.

This year 12 Knights helped set up the tables, the clothing racks, the book shelves and whatever else was needed – an estimated 51 man hours. The tear down probably did take quite as long; but it still took about 46 hours. Next, several Knight helped set-up the rummage sale – sorting clothing, pricing items, stocking the tables, and helped during the sale days as well. Certainly Jeff Traub, Jack Ramsden, Frank Salazar Mike Fitzgerald, Mike Clark, Larry Balagna, Jim Russell, and David Ybarra among others come to mind – an estimated 141 man hours. Next came the stage set-up. – 9 Knights including Antonio Razo, Efren Perez, Mario Luna, Mike Fitzgerald Jesus Medina, Miguel Hernandez, David Ybarra Larry Balagna and myself, came for that tack for a total of 26 man hours. Then the Midway was set-up and dismantled –many, many Knight took part in this. I'd say at least 180man hours. And in between all these tasks, Knights worked to organize the whole Festival – kudos to Chris Kubin, Joe Cuellar, Efrain Ochoa, Mike Moloughney, Gamaliel Hernandez Dr. Nieto, and many others – I'm just guessing here; but I'd say



140 man hours. And finally Knights cooked the hamburgers, turkey legs and hot dogs - an estimated 66 man hours. So the total estimated time Knights worked to make the Fall Festival a success was 650 man hours.
