WELCOME NEW KNIGHTS

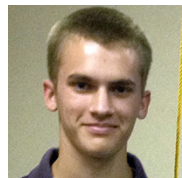
BRENT FLYNN

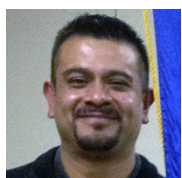
BOB MULLIGAN
